The Activities of the Holy Spirit in the Life of Man



Today marks the start of a series of bulletin articles on the activities of the Holy Spirit in the life of man. There will be three parts to this series: (1) the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit; (2) the Twelve Fruits of the Holy Spirit; and (3) the Charisms of the Holy Spirit. We begin with the Seven Gifts.

Part One: The Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit Introduction

Pope Francis reminds us that the Holy Spirit Himself is "the gift of God" (John 4:10), who communicates to us many spiritual gifts, including the Seven Gifts. * The Roman Catechism says that "from these gifts of the Holy Ghost ... we derive rules of Christian life and are enabled to know if the Holy Ghost dwells within us." **

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that these Seven Gifts "complete and perfect the virtues of those who receive them. They make [us] docile in readily obeying divine inspirations." *** Saint Thomas Aquinas wrote that the Seven Gifts are habits whereby man is perfected to obey readily the Holy Ghost. †

Bishop Arthur Serratelli has the following to say about the Gifts.

The seven gifts are our inheritance as baptized and confirmed Christians. We do not earn them. We do not merit them. They are given to us gratuitously [in Baptism and Confirmation]. They make us open to the promptings of the Holy Spirit in our lives. They help us grow in holiness, making us fit for heaven. ††

The prophet Isaiah lists six characteristics or effects of the Lord's Spirit, which are the source of the traditional names of the gifts of the Holy Spirit (Isaiah 11:2-3a): wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, fear of the Lord, and fear of the Lord. Note that the Hebrew text lists fear of the Lord twice.

In the Septuagint (a pre-Christian Greek translation of the Hebrew Bible) and in the Latin Vulgate Bible, the word **piety** (sometimes translated as *Godliness*) replaced the first instance of *fear of the* Lord in the Hebrew text, thereby specifying seven gifts.

The Roman Catechism and the Catechism of the Catholic Church name the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit as follows: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. In Latin, the Seven Gifts are sapientia, intellectus, consilium, fortitudo, scientia, pietas, and timor Dei.

OUR EXTENDED FAMILY - THE SAINTS IN HEAVEN

MONDAY, JULY 15 Blessed Anne Mary Javouhey



Daughter of a wealthy farmer, she grew up during the French Revolution, and saw her family risk everything by hiding priests. Pious girl who wanted to devote herself to teaching children and helping the poor. In 1800 she had a vision in Besançon where she was surrounded by a group of black children, but did not understand it at the time.

In 1807, she and eight friends at Cabillon started the group that would become the Congregation of Saint Joseph of Cluny, which was formally founded in 1812 when the group purchased an old friary at Cluny to act as the mother-house. The group was dedicated to teaching, and soon became famous for its innovative techniques. Anne established houses in Europe, Africa, and South America.

In 1834 the French government sent her to French Guiana where she was to teach 600 Guianan slaves who were about to receive their freedom. She spent nine years there teaching, fulfilling her vision. In 1843 she returned to her home-

land to work on establishing houses in other countries.

Born: November 10, 1779 at Jallanges, France; **Died:** July 15, 1851 at Paris, France of natural causes; Beatified: October 15, 1950 by Pope Pius XII

WEDNESDAY, JULY 17 Saint Alexius of Rome

The only son of a wealthy Christian Roman senator. The young man wanted to devote himself to God, but his parents arranged a marriage for him. On his wedding day his fiancée agreed to release him and let him follow his vocation. He fled his parent's home disguised as a beggar, and lived near a church in Syria. A vision of Our Lady at the church pointed him out as exceptionally holy, calling him the "Man of God". This drew attention to him, which caused him to return to Rome, Italy where he would not be known. He came as a beggar to his own home. His parents did not recognize him, but were kind to all the poor, and let him stay there. Alexis lived for seventeen years in a corner Omer's monastery in France. Orunder the stairs, praying, and teaching catechism to small children. At his death an unseen voice was heard to proclaim him 'The



Man of God', and afterwards his family found a note on his body which told them who he was and how he had lived his life of penance from the day of his wedding until then, for the love of God.

Died: early 5th century; **Canonized:** Pre-Congregation

FRIDAY, JULY 19 **Saint John Plessington**



Son of Robert Plessington, a royalist Catholic, and Alice Rawstone. His family was persecuted for both their religious and politi-

cal beliefs. John was educated by Jesuits at Scarisbrick Hall, then at the Royal College of Saint Alban at Valladolid, Spain, and then Saint dained in Segovia, Spain on March 25, 1662. He returned to England in 1663 to minister to covert Catholics in the areas of Holywell and Cheshire, often hiding under the name William Scarisbrick. Tutor at Puddington Hall near Chester, England. Imprisoned for two months, and executed for the crime of priesthood. One of the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales.

Born: c.1637 at Dimples Hall, Lancashire, England; Died: hanged, drawn, and quartered on July 19, 1679 at Barrows Hill, Boughton, England; Canonized: October 25, 1970 by Pope Saint Paul VI




